Reynolds receives grant to support symposium

Lawrence Reynolds, co-director of the Center for Nutrition and Pregnancy and professor of animal sciences, has received a grant from the USDA-CSREES-NRI to support the "Aspen Perinatal Biology Symposium."

Reynolds is co-organizing the symposium scheduled for Aug. 25-27 at the Givens Institute, Aspen, Colo. Other sponsors include NDSU, University of Colorado, University of Cincinnati, National Institutes of Health, March of Dimes, Canadian Institutes of Health Research and Ross Products Division of Abbott Laboratories.

The symposium will bring together clinicians and scientists, established senior and new investigators and trainees from around the world to report and discuss their findings in an atmosphere conducive to frank, yet amicable, exchange. The meeting has the overarching theme of the development of healthy offspring and the long-term consequences of abnormal development in utero. The speakers and attendees include some of the world's experts in the area of developmental programming.

Pawel Borowicz, David Carlson, Joel Caton, Justin Luther, Kasey Maddock-Carlin, Dale Redmer and Kimberly Vonnahme, all of the Center for Nutrition and Pregnancy and the Department of Animal Sciences at NDSU, will join Reynolds at the symposium. Each person will deliver presentations on their research in developmental programming.
